**No. 155. THE CUSTOMS LAW, 1936.**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1754  
MADE UNDER SECTION 52.**

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Law, 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Cotton (Restriction) Order, 1937.

2. In this Order—

“Cotton plant” means the plants, cuttings, buds and grafts, seeds, leaves, bolls or any portion of the cotton plant, whether living or dead;

“Raw cotton” means unginmed or seed cotton.

3. The importation into the Colony of any of the goods enumerated in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited save under licence under the hand of the Director of Agriculture and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in such licence.

4. The Importation of Cotton Order, 1925, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

**SCHEDULE.**

*Goods.*

1. Cotton plant.
2. Cotton seed.
3. Packing material which has or is suspected of having been used in the transportation or storage of any cotton plant.
4. Raw cotton.
