ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1940

MADE UNDER SECTION 59 (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 59 (b) of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Prohibited Exports (Vine Plants and Cuttings) Order, 1940.

2. From and after the 10th day of April, 1940, the exportation of all vine plants or cuttings (rooted or otherwise) of whatsoever variety is prohibited save under the authority of a licence granted by the Director of Agriculture, who may specify in such licence the quantity that may be exported and impose such terms and conditions as to him may seem desirable.

3. The Director of Agriculture shall not refuse to grant a licence in respect of a variety unless he is satisfied that the demand in the Colony for such variety is greater than the available supply.

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Amendment (No. 6) Order, 1940, and shall be read

as one with the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Orders, 1940 to (No. 5) 1940, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Orders, 1940 to (No. 6) 1940.
