THE DANGEROUS DRUGS LAWS, 1925 TO 1932.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 5.

Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1926, (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1926 and 1940.

2. Regulation 12 of the principal Regulations together with the heading thereof is hereby repealed and the following Regulation and heading substituted therefor :—

“COCA LEAVES AND INDIAN HEMP.

12. The provisions of this Part of these Regulations shall be deemed to apply to coca leaves and to Indian hemp in the same manner as they apply to raw opium.”
