No. 88. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1929

MADE UNDER SECTION 59.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 59 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Prohibited Exports (Essential Goods) Order, 1940.

2. The exportation from the Colony—

(a) of the goods specified in the First Schedule hereto to all destinations;

(b) of the goods specified in the Second Schedule hereto to all destinations other than British ports and ports in Palestine and Egypt,

is prohibited save under a licence granted by the Governor and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such licence.

3. The Prohibited Exports (Essential Goods) Orders, 1939 to 1940, are hereby revoked.

No. 89. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1930

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Importation of Insects and Leeches) (Restriction) Order, 1940.

2. The importation of leeches into the Colony is hereby absolutely prohibited.

3. From and after the 13th March, 1940, the importation into the Colony of any living insect and of any cultures of bacteria, fungi or of any other organism capable of attacking plants, animals or insects is hereby prohibited save under licence under the hand of the Director of Agriculture and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in such licence:

Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to silkworms or to eggs of silkworm moths the importation whereof into the Colony is prohibited or regulated under the Silkworm Industry Protection Laws, 1922 and 1925, or any amendment thereof.
