4. During the continuance in force of these regulations, regulations 2, 8 and 10 of the regulations contained in the Fourth Schedule to the principal Law shall be suspended and the following regulations shall have effect in lieu thereof:—

Suspension of regulations 2, 8 and 10 of the regulations contained in the Fourth Schedule to the principal Law.

" 2. The poll shall be taken on a Sunday to be appointed by the Commissioner. The hours of polling shall be from seven a.m. to noon and from one p.m. to six p.m., or may be continued to such later hour up to midnight as the Commissioner in his unfettered discretion may deem fit and so direct.

8. Ballot boxes shall be of a kind to be approved by the Governor,

10.—(1) Not more than ten voters shall be allowed in the polling station at the same time. On admission each voter shall in the presence of the persons named in regulation 6 of the principal Regulations state his name and place of residence and shall be identified by the village representative of his quarter, and the voter shall thereupon deliver to the presiding officer his voters card. Upon receipt of the voters card the presiding officer shall cause a mark to be placed against the name of such voter in a copy of the electors roll which he shall have available for that purpose.

(2) In this regulation the expression 'the principal Regulations' means the regulations contained in the Fourth Schedule to the principal Law.

(3) Any person who delivers to the presiding officer a voters card knowing the same to be forged shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment."

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 1.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Amendment of the Municipal Corporations (Appointment of Councils) Laws, 1938 and 1940, Regulations, 1941.
