CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

NOTICE No. 71 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of parts 10, 11, 12, 13 and 15 and the substitution therefor of the following parts:—

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 14 of the word “Imported” after “PART 14”.

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 17 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

“PART 17.—LOCAL CHEESE.

In this part of the Schedule—

the term ‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of local cheese in quantities in excess of 5 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.

Modification: Provided that where kaskavalli or tyri is sold in any town or village other than Nicosia there may be added to the maximum retail price one piastre per oke.”

D.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 22 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

“PART 22.—FUEL OIL.

E.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 23 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

Provided that kerosene, when sold by the oke in quantities not exceeding 4 okes, may be sold at a price not exceeding 6½ piastres per oke, on the basis of 11 okes net per 4 gallons.

Limitation: No retailer shall be obliged to sell kerosene in a new sealed tin (with tin) in the following places: Nicosia, Famagusta, Larnaca, Limassol, Paphos, Kyrenia, Polis, Xeros, Lefkoniko, Peristerona (Nicosia District), Morphou and Lefkara.”

F.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 24 and the substitution thereof of the following part :—

“PART 24.—PETROL.

Limitation : No retailer shall be obliged to sell petrol in a new sealed tin (with tin) in the following places : Nicosia, Famagusta, Larnaca, Limassol, Paphos, Kyrenia, Polis, Xeros, Lefkoniko, Peristerona (Nicosia District), Morphou and Lefkara.”

No. 199. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

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No. 200. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1942, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stationary Engines) Order, 1942.

2. In this Order—

“owner” means any person who has in his possession or under his control any stationary engine and shall include any person who is in possession of a stationary engine by nature of a hire purchase agreement.

3. On or before the 12th June, 1942, every owner of any stationary engine shall complete and deliver to me at Nicosia a return in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

4. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, or

(b) makes, under clause 3 of this Order, a return which is false in any material particular,

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1942.
