

(3) Every such tribunal shall have jurisdiction to try summarily all offences against these regulations and shall have all the powers of an Assize Court.

(4) The proceedings of every such tribunal shall conform, as nearly as may be, with the practice and procedure for the time being in force relating to the hearing of criminal matters by an Assize Court.

(5) The judgment of every such tribunal shall be final and conclusive and no appeal shall lie therefrom :

Provided that where any person has been sentenced to suffer death the proceedings shall be subject to review by a Court of Review consisting of not less than three Judges of the Supreme Court, or two Judges of the Supreme Court and one President of a District Court.

(6) For the purpose of this regulation the term ' Judge of the Supreme Court ' shall include an acting Judge of the Supreme Court.

(7) In the reviewing of proceedings the Court of Review shall have all the powers granted to the Supreme Court by sub-section (1) of section 40 of the Courts of Justice Laws, 1935 to 1940, on the hearing of criminal appeals in so far as such powers may be applicable, and any reference in such sub-section to ' District Court ' shall be construed as a reference to any special tribunal established under this regulation.

(8) The Governor, with the assistance and advice of the Chief Justice, may by writing under the hand and official seal of the Governor and the hand of the Chief Justice make Rules of Court for regulating the practice (including forms) in respect of any proceeding under this regulation before the Court of Review."

4. The Defence (Amendment No. 4) Regulations, 1942, are hereby revoked.

No. 225. THE CYPRUS GOVERNMENT RAILWAY LAW, 1906.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

C. C. WOOLLEY,
Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Cyprus Government Railway Law, 1906, do hereby make the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Railway (Amendment) Regulations, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Railway Regulations, 1939 to (No. 4) 1941, (hereinafter referred to as " the principal Regulations ") and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Railway Regulations, 1939 to 1942.

2. The following parts of the First Schedule to the principal Regulations are hereby amended as follows :—

(a) PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

(i) By the deletion in paragraph (9) (b) of the figure " 15 " and the substitution therefor of the figure " 20 ".

(ii) By the deletion of paragraph 1(12).
