THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES)
CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

NOTICE No. 73 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part I and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

"PART 1.—WHEAT.

Condition :

Where sales of wheat are made by the Government the purchaser shall surrender to the Government on each occasion a number of empty bags in good condition equivalent to the number of bags purchased by him."

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 2 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

"PART 2.—BARLEY.

Modification :

Any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in any barley in excess of the maximum percentage of 4% permitted by the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Regulations, 1940 and 1941, shall not be paid for and there may be deducted from the price of such barley, by the purchaser or the person taking delivery, any expenses required or incurred for cleaning such barley from any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in excess of 4% as aforesaid.

Condition :

Where sales of barley are made by the Government the purchaser shall surrender to the Government on each occasion a number of empty bags in good condition equivalent to the number of bags purchased by him."

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 3 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

"PART 3.—IMPORTED FLOUR.

Imported flour ..	5½ piastres per oke.	31 shillings per bag calculated on a basis of 52 okes net.

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term 'wholesale' means sale or purchase of imported flour in quantities of not less than one bag of approximately 52 okes net at any one time or at any single transaction.

Condition :

Where sales of flour are made by the Government the purchaser shall surrender to the Government on each occasion a number of empty bags in good condition equivalent to the number of bags purchased by him."

D.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 26 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

"PART 26.—WHOLE WHEAT FLOUR.

All towns and villages	5 piastres per oke.

Definition :

'Whole wheat flour' shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Sale of Barley Flour and Wheat Flour) Order, 1940."

E.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 27 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

"PART 27.—BARLEY FLOUR.

'Barley flour' shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Sale of Barley flour and Wheat flour) Order, 1940."

No. 240. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 6) 1942.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 6) 1942, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Bakery and Bread) Order, 1942.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

"bakery" means any building, room or place used for or connected with preparing, making or baking bread for sale whether by retail or wholesale;

"barley flour" means the ground products of the whole barley free from other cereals and any foreign matter and free from added bran;

"bread" means household bread of any size or shape and includes what are commonly known as koulouria or paximadia, franzola, cakes and biscuits;

"registered baker" means a person registered as a baker under this Order and shall include any person who had been registered as a baker under the repealed Defence (Bakers) Order, 1940 or the Defence (Registration of Bakers) Orders to (No. 2) 1940, hereby repealed;

"whole wheat flour" means the ground products of the whole wheat free from other cereals and any foreign matter and free from added bran and without any white flour or flour known as 'semolina' having been extracted therefrom.

3. No person shall keep or work a bakery unless such person is a registered baker.

4. Any person desiring to be registered under this Order as a registered baker shall complete and deliver to the Commissioner of his district an application specifying the place at which the bakery which he intends to keep or work is situated, and if his application is granted, such person shall be registered as a registered baker and thereupon the Commissioner of the district, shall grant to such person a certificate of registration.
