A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas in pursuance of Article 3 of the Cyprus Coinage Order, 1900, new bronze coinage of one piastre and half-piastre pieces have, at my request and with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and the Secretary of State, been coined under the direction of the Master of His Majesty's Mint for use in the Colony of Cyprus:

And whereas by paragraph (5) of the said Article 3 it is, *inter alia*, provided that if any new mixed metal coins are coined in pursuance of that Article and a proclamation is made with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury setting forth in a Schedule the like particulars with respect to each coin as are set forth in the Third Schedule to the said Order, the provisions of the said Order making the coins in the said Third Schedule current and legal tender in the Colony of Cyprus shall apply to the new coins as if the Schedule to the Proclamation formed part of the Third Schedule to the Order:

Now, therefore, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby proclaim that the Schedule hereto sets forth the particulars with respect to the said new one piastre and half-piastre pieces which are required by paragraph (5) of the said Article.
