THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1939, and of every other power hereunto enabling do hereby order and direct as follows:-

(a) that the village of Ayii Omoloyitadhes in the Nicosia District contained in the Schedule to the said Laws shall be deleted from the said Schedule as from the 1st day of November, 1943, and that any moneys in the Village Health Fund of the said village on the aforementioned date shall be paid into the town fund of the Municipal Corporation of Nicosia; and

(b) that the Order in Council No. 1805 made under the said section and published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 23rd September, 1938, as amended by subsequent Orders in Council shall be revoked as from the day in paragraph (a) hereof mentioned.

THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW, 1879.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

C. C. WOOLLEY,

Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, 1879, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations, 1908 to (No. 2) 1941, (hereinand shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations, 1908 to (No. 2) 1941, (herenafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Prison Regulations, 1908 to 1943.

2. Paragraph (1) of regulation 147A of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one piastre" (line 4) and the substitution therefor of the words "two piastres".

3. These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 10th September 1942.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943

Delegation of Powers under Paragraph (5) of Regulation 66.
