THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES)
CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

NOTICE No. 142 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 1 of the following:—

“Modification: Where purchases of wheat are made by Government the rate at which producers may be paid shall be 6 piastres per oke”.

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 2 of the following:—

“Modification: Where purchases of barley are made by Government the rate at which producers may be paid shall be 4 piastres per oke”.

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Parts 22 and 24 and the substitution therefor of the following parts respectively:—

“PART 22.—GAS OIL.

Modification:

Definitions :

- (1) 'company' means any firm registered under the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) Orders, 1943, as an importer of kerosene and any agent of such firm;
- (2) 'first retailer' means any person, firm or organization, authorized by the Commissioner in that behalf, which buys kerosene from any company for the purpose of re-sale;
- (3) 'second retailer' means any person, firm or organization, authorized by the Commissioner in that behalf, which buys kerosene from a first retailer for the purpose of re-sale: Provided that the Commissioner may in special cases authorize a 'second retailer' to buy kerosene from any company for the purpose of re-sale;
- (4) 'tin' means a new sealed tin of 4 gallons capacity.

Conditions :

- (1) When kerosene is sold in bulk or by the oke ex sealed tin, without the tin, the price shall be that shown in column (2) above, calculated on the net weight of the kerosene.
- (2) When kerosene is sold in sealed tins, with the tin, the purchaser shall have the option of buying (a) by weight or (b) by the tin.
If he elects to buy by weight, the price shall be that shown in column (2) above calculated on the net weight of the kerosene contained in the tin and for the purpose of such calculation the tin shall be deemed to weigh one oke. If he elects to buy by the tin, the price shall be that shown in column (3) above."

E.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 25 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

"PART 25.—IMPORTED SULPHUR.

F.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 35 and the substitution therefor of the following part:—

"PART 35.—EDIBLE COCONUT OIL.

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term 'wholesale' means the sale or purchase of edible coconut oil in quantities in excess of 10 okes at any one time or at any single transaction."
