No. 192. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Agricultural Produce Movement and Control) (Amendment) Order, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Agricultural Produce Movement and Control) Order, 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Agricultural Produce Movement and Control) Orders, 1944.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after clause 8 of the following clause:—

" 8A. Every person shall permit such person as I may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with, or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any application made by such person under the provisions of this Order."

3. Clause 10 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after paragraph (c) of the following paragraph:—

" (d) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under this Order ; "

No. 193. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Fuel and Charcoal) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

" charcoal " means the manufactured produce of fuelwood carbonized by means of a kiln ;

" Charcoal Controlled Area " means any area which the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may declare as a Charcoal Controlled Area under the provisions of clause 6 of this Order ;

" cord " in relation to fuelwood, means fuelwood of a size exceeding 3 feet in width or in length, stacked in a rectangular pile with dimensions normally 8 feet long and 4 feet wide by 4 feet high, the pile containing approximately 128 cubic feet ;

"fuelwood" means any wood of any sectional dimensions used or capable and suitable for being used as, or for being converted into firewood;

"Fuel and Charcoal Controller" means the person appointed by the Governor as Fuel and Charcoal Controller;

"Fuel and Charcoal Inspector" means a person appointed as such Inspector by the Fuel and Charcoal Controller;

"Fuelwood Controlled Area" means any area which the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may declare as a Fuelwood Controlled Area under the provisions of clause 6 of this Order.

3. Not later than six days after the last day of each month, commencing from the month of June, 1944, every person who has in his possession or under his control in any part of the Colony, any charcoal in excess of 60 okes or any fuelwood in excess of two tons or two cords shall complete and deliver to the Fuel and Charcoal Controller at Nicosia a return in the form of, and containing the particulars set out in, the First Schedule hereto.

4.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person shall, in any part of the Colony, sell, purchase, dispose of, deal with, remove or transport or permit or suffer to be removed or transported any quantity of charcoal save under a special permit issued under the hand of the Fuel and Charcoal Controller or a Fuel and Charcoal Inspector.

(2) Every special permit issued under this clause may contain such terms, limitations and conditions (including the price at which the charcoal may be sold, purchased, or disposed of) as may be specified therein.

(3) Nothing in this clause contained shall apply:—

(a) to any charcoal consumed by any person for his domestic use or requirements;

(b) to any charcoal purchased by any person from a Government store or dump or to the transportation by such person of any charcoal so purchased.

5. Every person who has in his possession or under his control, in any part of the Colony, any charcoal in excess of 60 okes or any fuelwood in excess of two tons or two cords shall keep on his premises such books or records and enter therein such matters, as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may from time to time direct.

6. The Fuel and Charcoal Controller may at any time by publication in the *Gazette* declare any area in the Colony specified therein to be a Fuelwood Controlled Area or a Charcoal Controlled Area.

7.—(1) No person shall sell, purchase, dispose of or otherwise deal with any fuelwood within, or shall transport any fuelwood into or from, a Fuelwood Controlled Area, save under a special permit issued under the hand of the Fuel and Charcoal Controller or a Fuel and Charcoal Inspector.

(2) No person shall burn or manufacture any charcoal within a Charcoal Controlled Area, save under a special permit issued under the hand of the Fuel and Charcoal Controller or a Fuel and Charcoal Inspector.

(3) Every special permit issued under the provisions of sub-clause (1) or (2) of this clause may contain such terms, conditions and limitations (including the price at which the fuelwood may be sold, purchased or disposed of) as may be specified therein.

(4) Nothing in this clause contained shall apply—

(a) to any fuelwood consumed by any person within a Fuelwood Controlled Area for his domestic use or requirements;

(b) to any fuelwood purchased by any person within a Fuelwood Controlled Area from a Government store or dump or to the transportation by such person of any fuelwood so purchased from such Fuelwood Controlled Area.

8. Subject to such definitions, conditions, exceptions, limitations, and modifications, if any, as are set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, no person shall—

(a) sell or purchase, or

(b) offer for sale or offer or attempt to sell or purchase, or

(c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale or purchase of,

any fuelwood or charcoal in any town or village in the Colony, at a price in excess of the price specified in the said Schedule which relates to such town or village.

9. Every person shall permit such person as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made under the provisions of clause 3 or of any entry made in any books or records kept under the provisions of clause 5 of this Order.

10. The Schedules hereto may be amended by me by notice published in the *Gazette* and upon such publication such amendment shall form part of this Order for all purposes.

11. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order;

(b) makes in any book or record kept under the provisions of clause 5 of this Order any entry which is false in any material particular;

- (c) makes, under any of the provisions of this Order, any return which is false in any material particular;
- (d) makes any false statement in any application for a permit under this Order;
- (e) fails to comply with any term, limitation or condition in any permit issued under this Order;
- (f) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.

12. The Defence (Control of Fuel and Charcoal) Orders, 1943, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder:

Provided that any area declared as a Fuelwood Controlled Area or Charcoal Controlled Area, and any direction given, under the Orders hereby revoked shall be deemed to be an area so declared, and a direction given, under and for the purposes of this Order.

**No. 194. THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF OILBURNERS) ORDER, 1944.****NOTICE No. 3 UNDER CLAUSE 2.**

I hereby specify the following to be a "Controlled Oilburner" for the purposes of the above Order :—

**DESCRIPTION.**

- (a) The type of Oilburner called and known as the "Utility" Oilburner.
- (b) The "Utility" Oilburner comprises an atomizing burner for all classes of oil fuel, the atomizing agent being steam or compressed air.
- (c) The "Utility" Oilburner consists of the following parts, viz :
- PART 1.—A thimble shaped hollow brass nozzle, threaded at one end and screwed to the oil feed pipe; the other end of the nozzle is tapered down in the form of a spindle extension on the end of which a fan shaped revolving impeller is mounted. The circumference of the nozzle is perforated in a number of circular orifices through which the oil is drawn.
- PART 2.—A circular brass reducer cap screwed to the flaring sleeve.
- PART 3.—A cylindrical flaring sleeve of brass or iron threaded on both sides screwed to the filler plug.
- PART 4.—A threaded brass filler plug through which pass and to which are welded the oil and steam/air feed pipes.
- (d) The oil is fed by gravity to the nozzle whence it is forced by a jet of steam or compressed air through the impeller vanes, which are rotated by the force of the jet. The oil is atomised by the steam or air jet outside the nozzle and the mixed spray is given a swirl by the action of the impeller. The flame is regulated by cocks fitted to the oil and steam/air feed pipes and by adjusting the position of the reducer cap.
- (e) The "Utility" Oilburner is more particularly described in a sunprint plan deposited with and held by the Conservator of Forests.
