## No. 228. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

APPOINTMENT OF COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 3.

- I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 3 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, do hereby appoint the Controller of Transport and Marketing to be a Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.
- 2. This appointment is in addition to and not in derogation of any other appointment made for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.

## THE FOREST LAW, 1939.

## NOTICE UNDER SECTION 11.

Notice is hereby given that with the approval of the Conservator of Forests the forests set out in the Schedule hereto have been placed under the protection, control and management of the Government under section 11 of the Forest Law, 1939, for the periods set out against each such forest, respectively.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. Forest (including all plantations and trees) belonging to Mr. N. P. Lanitis situated near the village of Cherkez in the District of Limassol, for a period of five years from the 1st January. 1944.

2. Forest (including all plantations and trees) belonging to Mrs. Anna Nicolaides situated near the village of Yermasoyia in the District of Limassol, for a period of five years from the 1st January, 1944.

3. Forest (including all plantations and trees) belonging to Kykko Monastery situated near the village of Ayios Ioannis in the District of Paphos, for a period of one year from the 1st May, 1944.
