I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Governor in Council by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1944, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Oil-burning Appliances) Exemption Order, 1944.

2. The oil-burning appliances of the types set out in the Schedule hereto and any parts thereof imported into the Colony shall be admitted free from all import duties.

3. This Order shall be deemed to have been made on the 3rd August, 1944 :

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any oil-burning appliances which have been sold by the importer before the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*.

2. Oil-burning heating stoves.
3. Oil-burners for geysers.

**No. 374. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1944.**

**ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as a Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944, I hereby order as follows:—
