PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER SECTION 11A.

Whereas by section 11A of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, as amended by the Amendment of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, (Defence) Regulations, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, call out and mobilize the Force or any part thereof for actual service whenever it appears advisable to do so :

And whereas it appears to me advisable to call out and mobilize a certain officer :

Now, therefore, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 11A of the said Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, as amended by the Amendment of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, (Defence) Regulations, 1942, do hereby, by this Proclamation, call out and mobilize the following officer as from the 1st August, 1945 :—

Captain James Arthur Paul Greenwood.
