THE LANDING AND SHIPPING CHARGES LAW, 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2186

MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Landing and Shipping Charges Law, 1933, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Landing and Shipping Charges (Amendment) Order, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Landing and Shipping Charges Order, 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Landing and Shipping Charges Orders, 1942 and 1946.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after clause 6 of the following clause:—

"6A. Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained the Comptroller of Customs may at any time increase any of the rates for landing charges or for portorage, as contained in Part I of the First and Second Schedules hereto, by an amount not exceeding one hundred per centum and may at any time reduce or cancel any such increase."

3. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 24th day of February, 1946.

No. 108. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1945.
