**No. 14. THE GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES PROVIDENT  
FUND LAW, 1945.**

**THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1945.**

**ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1945, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Flour Milling) Order, 1946.
2. In this Order—  
“mixed wheat and barley” means wheat and barley mixed in the proportion of 85% wheat and 15% barley.
3. From and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no wheat other than mixed wheat and barley shall be ground at any mill save under a written permit issued by me.

4. No miller shall, save under a written permit issued by me, have in his possession or under his control wheat and barley other than mixed wheat and barley.

5. Any permit issued under the provisions of clause 3 or 4 of this Order may contain such terms and conditions as I may deem fit to impose.

6. Every miller shall keep in his mill a book in which he shall enter or cause to be entered at the end of each day the following particulars:—

(a) the name with full address of the person who delivered the mixed wheat and barley for milling, the date of receipt of such mixed wheat and barley and the actual amount of such mixed wheat and barley received by the miller;

(b) the actual amount of ground products of mixed wheat and barley delivered and the date of such delivery.

7. Every miller shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the district in which his mill is situated, may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon his mill and make—

(a) such enquiries or inspection therein; and

(b) such inspection of any book kept under clause 6 of this Order,

as may be necessary for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

8. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order; or

(b) makes in any book kept under clause 6 of this Order any entry which is false in any material particular; or

(c) fails to comply with any term or condition contained in any permit issued under this Order; or

(d) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1945.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 4) 1945.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1945, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Milling Charges) Order, 1946.

2. In this Order—

“mixed wheat and barley” means wheat and barley mixed in the proportion of 85% wheat and 15% barley;

“charges” means all charges for the cleaning, washing and milling of mixed wheat and barley.
