With reference to the Directions given under section 10 of the above Laws published under Nos. 142 and 130 in Supplement No. 3 of the *Gazettes* of the 24th May, 1945, and 18th April, 1946, respectively, His Excellency has been pleased to direct that officers and other ranks of the Cyprus Volunteer Force who have been demobilized may, if they so desire, wear their uniform on the following occasion, that is to say:—  
8th June, 1946, Victory Celebrations.

No. 169. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 207 (1).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 207 (1) of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Municipal Elections (Closing of Licensed Premises) (Larnaca) Order, 1946.

2. In this Order—

“licensed premises” means any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquors by retail under the provisions of the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors Law, 1943.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors (Retailers Closing Hours) Order, 1945,—

(a) all licensed premises situated within the municipal limits of the village of Lefkara shall be closed and remain closed from sunrise on the 19th day of May, 1946, until midnight of the same day;

(b) all licensed premises situated within the municipal limits of the town of Larnaca shall be closed and remain closed from sunrise on the 26th day of May, 1946, until midnight of the same day.
