**No. 106. THE COURTS OF JUSTICE LAWS, 1935 TO 1947.**

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 16 (4).

**THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.**

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

WINSTER,  
*Governor.*

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Laws ;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, in particular, they have undertaken that if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils, and to make them good citizens of the British Empire;

Now, therefore, I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, do hereby grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names.

**No. 108. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.**

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 6.

WINSTER,  
*Governor.*

With reference to the Notification published in Supplement No. 3 of the *Gazette* of the 8th August, 1946, under No. 267 (notifying the Governor's sanction for the acquisition of certain immovable properties in connection with the erection of a public Secondary School at Limassol);

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, and of every other power thereunto enabling, do hereby revoke the said notification in so far as it relates to the plots referred to in paragraph (b) to the Schedule thereto under the following numbers, that is to say:—

“90/1/1”, “86/3”, “86/2/1”, “87” and “89/1”.

2. This notification shall be deemed to have been made on the 5th day of August, 1946, and so that nothing contained in the notification referred to in the first paragraph hereinbefore shall be deemed to have vested in the public body concerned the ownership of the plots hereinbefore mentioned.

But save as in this notification stated, the notification referred to in the first paragraph hereinbefore shall be and shall remain of full force and effect.
