No. 225. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1946.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2254

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1946, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Oil-burning Appliances) Exemption (Amendment) Order, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Import Duty (Oil-burning Appliances) Exemption Orders, 1944 and 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Import Duty (Oil-burning Appliances) Exemption Orders, 1944 to 1947.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following items:—

- "4. Oil-burning hot water boilers.
5. Oil-burning irons.
6. Oil-burning wash boilers."

No. 226. THE ARMY ACT.
