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**No. 354. THE PUBLIC RIVERS PROTECTION LAW, 1930.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2269  
MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 3 of the Public Rivers Protection Law, 1930, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Haji Halil River (Protection) Order, 1947.

2. The portion of the public river known as "Potamos tou Haji Halil", in the town of Kyrenia, beginning at the point at which it is crossed by the municipal boundary of Kyrenia, at the most northern point of plot No. 14 of the Government Survey Plan No. XII/29 and proceeding downstream to the mouth of the said river on the seashore (near the Sea View Hotel), is hereby declared to be a river for the purposes of the Public Rivers Protection Law, 1930.

THE VILLAGE AUTHORITIES (FEES REGULATION) LAW, 1943.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) Law, 1943, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) (Amendment) Order, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) Order, 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Village Authorities (Fees Regulation) Orders, 1943 and 1947.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion from both columns of the First Schedule thereto of item D and the substitution therefor of the following item:—

Law	Fees
D.—The Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1947. Sections 8 (1), 27 (1) (b) and 29.	D.—(a) Under section 8 (1): the fee for the Mukhtar shall be calculated at the rate of 5% on the amount required for the purposes of section 5 (such fee not to exceed £5 in any one year); (b) under paragraph (b) of section 27 (1): the fee payable by the claimant for the price of paper and writer's fee shall be 2s.; (c) under section 29 (1): the fee (to be retained by the Mukhtar) payable together with the amount due shall be 1½p. for every shilling of the amount due."
