**THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.**

**BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION  
OF LEFKA.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations  
Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal  
Corporation of Lefka hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Lefka Municipal (Amendment)  
Bye-laws, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Lefka Municipal  
Bye-laws, 1940 and 1943 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal  
Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together  
be cited as the Lefka Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1947.

2. Chapter 10 of Part II, and bye-laws 74, 75 and 76 of the principal  
Bye-laws are hereby deleted and the following Chapter and bye-laws  
substituted therefor :—

*"Chapter 10.—Fees for Weighing, Measuring and Testing of Goods.*

74. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 184 of the  
Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, for the weighing,  
measuring or testing of goods within the municipal limits, shall be the  
fees set forth in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws.

75. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 189 of the  
Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, in respect of goods  
brought within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the  
Third Schedule to these bye-laws.

76.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any  
person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the  
goods enumerated in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws, such person  
shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corpora-  
tion, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two  
paras per oke in respect thereof and such municipal weigher shall give  
to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof  
from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time  
to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require  
the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with  
such printed receipt :

Provided that :—

- (a) fractions under five paras shall not be collected ;
- (b) for fractions of five paras and over and under fifteen paras  
the sum of ten paras shall be collected ;
- (c) for fractions of fifteen paras and over and under twenty paras  
the sum of twenty paras shall be collected.

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be twenty paras.

(2) Nothing in this bye-law contained:—

(a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws; or

(b) shall be taken or construed to give any municipal weigher or to the Municipal Corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies.”

3. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the addition immediately after the Second Schedule thereto of the following Schedule:—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that :—

- fractions under 10 paras shall not be collected ;
- for fractions of 10 paras and over and under 30 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected ;
- for fractions of 30 paras and over and under 40 paras the sum of 40 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1p."

4. Bye-law 139 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 139. The following rates shall be paid by the owner or occupier or lessee of any premises or building or place supplied with town water, that is to say :—

- For one massouri of town water : For a period of one year .. .. . £8
- For half a massouri of town water : For a period of one year .. .. . £4
- For one quarter of a massouri of town water : For a period of one year .. .. . £2 "

5. Paragraph (a) of bye-law 141G of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words " fifteen shillings " (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the words " twenty shillings ".

The above bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Acting Governor, (M.P. 1425/12/2.)
