No. 90. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1946.

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1946, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Charcoal) Exemption Order, 1947.
2. All charcoal imported into the Colony shall be admitted free from all import duties.

No. 91. THE DANGEROUS DRUGS LAWS, 1925 TO 1932.

Whereas by section 11 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932, power is conferred on the Governor by Order in Council to declare that Part III of the said Laws shall apply to any derivative of morphine and to any other drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section 11 if it appears to him that the first mentioned drugs are or are likely to be productive, if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be productive; if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by Indian hemp, morphine or cocaine:
