THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTIONS 2 (5) AND 9.

WINSTER,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2 (5) and 9 of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945 (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) (Germany) Order, 1948.

2. Clauses 3, 6 and 7 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Orders, 1940 and 1941, (requiring payment of certain moneys to the Custodian and imposing restrictions and requirements in regard to certain property in the Colony) shall not apply to—

(a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable to or for the benefit of any person within the description contained in clause 3 of this Order on or after the 28th January, 1948, by reason of any business authorized by clause 2 of the Trading with the Enemy (Authorization) (Germany) Order, 1948;

(b) any property which on or after the 28th January, 1948, comes into the ownership of any such person as aforesaid by reason of any such trade as aforesaid;
