

Chapter 4.—*Animal Market.*

Rule 55. The Village Health Commission may from time to time appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be the animal market.

Rule 56. The control and management of the animal market are hereby vested in the person appointed from time to time by the Village Health Commission to be the Inspector of the animal market (hereinafter in this chapter of these rules referred to as the "Inspector") subject to the instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Village Health Commission.

Rule 57. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by any person exposing for sale any animal in the animal market, that is to say :—

| (c) for every pig, over six months of age | 4p. |
| (d) for every pig under six months | 2p. |
| (e) For every goat, ewe, lamb, kid | 2p. |

Rule 66.—(a) All bread exposed for sale within the village must be properly baked and be kept clean from flies and dust.

(b) All bread exposed for sale within the village shall be made into loaves of 400 drams and half loaves of 200 drams each.

(c) Any bread badly baked or of short weight exposed for sale shall be confiscated by the Inspector and be dealt with in such manner as the Village Health Commission may direct.

No. 206.**THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1943.**

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Vasa (Kilani), in the District of Limassol, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF VASA (KILANI)
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1943, the Village Health Commission of Vasa (Kilani) hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health Vasa (Kilani) (Amendment) Rules, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Village Health Vasa (Kilani) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health Vasa (Kilani) Rules, 1938 and 1948.

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2. Rules 20 and 46, of the principal Rules are hereby repealed and the following rules substituted therefor, respectively :—

“ *Rule 20.* The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in a slaughter-house, that is to say :—

- (a) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep 3*p.*
 (b) For every bullock, camel, cow, ox or swine 1*s.*

Rule 46. The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

- (a) For every carcass of goat, kid, lamb or sheep or part thereof—
 of 20 okes and over 6*p.*
 of under 20 okes 4½*p.*
 (b) For every carcass of bullock, camel, cow or ox, or part thereof 1*s.*
 (c) For every carcass of swine or part thereof—
 of 20 okes and over 1*s.*
 of under 20 okes 4½*p.*

(2) The fees in paragraph (1) of this rule prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a monthly or yearly lessee of any shop, stall or place in the meat market under rule 45 of these Rules.”

3. Part I of the Schedule to the principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following rules immediately after Rule 48 :—

“ *Chapter 4.—Market of Foodstuffs.*

Rule 55. The Village Health Commission may from time to time appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be the market of foodstuffs.

Rule 56. The management and control of the market of foodstuffs are hereby vested in the person appointed from time to time by the Village Health Commission to be the Inspector of the market of foodstuffs (hereinafter in this chapter of these Rules referred to as ‘the Inspector’), subject to the instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Village Health Commission.

Rule 57.—Any person exposing for sale any foodstuffs in the market of foodstuffs shall pay to the Inspector a fee of 3 shillings for every motor-lorry or cart of such foodstuffs exposed for sale therein.

Rule 58. In this chapter of these Rules the term ‘foodstuffs’ means any marketable commodities, articles, things or liquids used for human consumption but does not include any perishable goods or fresh meat.

Chapter 4A.—Cattle Market.

Rule 58A. The Village Health Commission may from time to time by public notification appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be a cattle market.

The management and control of the cattle market are hereby vested in the person appointed from time to time by the Village Health Commission to be the Inspector of the cattle market (hereinafter in these rules referred to as the ‘Inspector’), subject to the instructions which he may receive from time to time from the Village Health Commission.

Rule 58B.—Any person exposing for sale in the cattle market any mule, donkey, bullock, ox or swine shall pay to the Inspector a fee of 1 shilling for every such animal exposed for sale therein.”

4. Part II of the Schedule to the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ Rules 1, 2, 21, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 78 and 81 ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ Rules 1, 2, 21, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 78 and 81 ”. (M.P. 1347/37/9.)
