

road from Nicosia to Myrtou ; thence westwards along the said main road to the south-eastern corner of plot No. 80 of Block N, Ayios Dhometios village, at a junction of roads ; thence northwards along the western side of the road leading to the most northern point of plot No. 89 of the said Block, at a junction of roads ; thence north-eastwards along the northern side of the road leading to the south-eastern corner of plot No. 126 of the said Block at a junction of roads ; thence northwards along the western side of the road leading to the junction of roads at the north-eastern corner of plot No. 133 of Block N, Ayios Dhometios village ; thence north-westwards along the southern side of the road leading to the cross-roads at the south-eastern corner of plot No. 164 of Block B, Ayios Dhometios village ; thence northwards along the western side of a road to the south-eastern corner of plot No. 53 of Block H, Ayios Dhometios village, at a cross-roads ; thence eastwards along the northern side of a road to the cross-roads at the south-eastern corner of plot No. 51 of the said Block ; thence northwards and north-eastwards along the western and northern side of a road to the most southern corner of plot No. 3 of Block K, Ayios Dhometios village ; thence northwards along the western boundary of the said plot to the road forming the southern boundary of the Nicosia Golf Course ; thence eastwards along the northern side of the said road to the right bank of the River Pedieos ; thence northwards along the said bank to the Cyprus Government Railway Bridge ; thence eastwards along the southern side of the said Railway to the western side of the road from the tannery near the Golf Course to the village of Trakhonas ; thence north-eastwards along the western side of the said road to the point of commencement, all which said boundary is hatched in black on the Government Survey Plan Serial No. 1384.

THE QUARANTINE LAW, 1932.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

WINSTER,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Quarantine (Special Anti-Cholera) Regulations, 1948, and shall be read in conjunction with the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1946, and the Quarantine (Aircraft) Regulations, 1937 to 1945, and expressions in these Regulations shall have the same meaning as in the aforesaid Regulations, respectively.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any public instrument, save under the authority, and in accordance with the terms and conditions, of a permit granted by the Director of Medical and Health Services—

(a) no person coming to Cyprus in any vessel which commenced its voyage or touched at any place in Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, including a person in transit through Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, shall disembark from such vessel in Cyprus elsewhere than at the port of Famagusta or Limassol ;

(b) no person coming to Cyprus in any aircraft which commenced its voyage or touched at any place in Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, including a person in transit through Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, shall disembark from such aircraft in Cyprus elsewhere than at the Nicosia Airport ;

- (c) every person coming to Cyprus in any vessel or aircraft which commenced its voyage or touched at any place in Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, including a person in transit through Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, shall be in possession of a valid certificate of inoculation against cholera on international form and any person not in possession of any such certificate may be placed under quarantine or surveillance during a period of five days.

No. 49. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1948.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 70.

WINSTER,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 70 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1948, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1948.

2. The rent to be paid on any goods deposited in any Customs warehouses shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1933 to 1937, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
