Raw hides and raw skins, undressed (excluding fur skins) which the Comptroller is satisfied are imported for further manufacture in the Colony shall be admitted at reduced rates of import duty, that is to say, at the rate of five per centum *ad valorem* in the preferential tariff and ten per centum *ad valorem* in the general tariff.
