No. 282. THE SHOP ASSISTANTS LAW.
CAP. 159 AND LAW 8 OF 1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2544
MADE UNDER SECTION 19.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 19 of the Shop Assistants Law, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Assistants (Afternoon Week-day) Closing Order, 1952.

2. The day set out in the third column of the Schedule hereto is hereby appointed as the day in every week on which the class of shops set out in the second column of the said Schedule, corresponding to such day, shall be closed in each one of the towns or villages set out in the first column of the said Schedule corresponding to such class of shops and day:

Provided always that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any shop solely kept open for one or more of the purposes set forth, for the time being, in the First Schedule to the Shop Assistants Law,
