THE SHOP ASSISTANTS LAW.

CAP. 159 AND LAW 8 OF 1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2545

MADE UNDER SECTION 19.

A. B. WRIGHT,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 19 of the Shop Assistants Law, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Assistants (Closing Hours) Variation Order, 1952.

2. Every shop, to which the provisions of section 4 of the Law apply shall, in lieu of the hours therein provided, close—

(a) not later than seven o'clock in the evening on every Friday in the months of October to March, both inclusive, in every year and not later than half-past eight o'clock in the evening on every Friday in the months of April to September, both inclusive, in every year;

(b) not later than half-past eight o'clock in the evening during a period commencing on the 20th December, in every year and ending on the 2nd January in the ensuing year, both dates inclusive.

3. Every grocery shop, the closing afternoon of which, under section 5 of the Law, is on a Saturday, shall, in lieu of the hours therein provided, close not later than two o'clock in the afternoon of such Saturday.

4. When Christmas Day, New Year's Day, the first day of Ramazan Bairam and of Qurban Bairam or the principal annual fair in any town, village or area where the Law applies falls on a Sunday or Monday, the

provisions of section 5 shall cease to apply to any shop in such town, village or area in respect of the preceding Saturday and any such shop shall close not later than half-past eight o'clock in the evening on such Saturday.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 19 of the Shop Assistants Law, I, the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Assistants (Hours of Employment) Variation Order, 1952.

2. Every shop assistant to whom section 7 of the Law applies shall not be employed in any capacity whatsoever for a longer period than fifty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week, in lieu of the period therein provided:

Provided that a shop assistant who has not attained the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for a longer period than forty-four hours, excluding meal times, in any one week.
