THE INCREASE OF RENT (RESTRICTION) LAW.
CAP. 108 AND LAWS 28 OF 1949 AND 12 OF 1953.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Increase of Rent (Restriction) Law, and of every other power thereunto enabling, I, the Governor, do hereby appoint, with effect from the 1st April, 1953, Mr. Ch. Pierides to be President of the Rent Assessment Board of Famagusta, in the place of Mr. A. S. Stavrinides, and I do hereby direct that the part of the Schedule to the Notification No. 257 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th September, 1947, relating to Famagusta (as amended by Notifications Nos. 485, 278, 154 and 204 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 22nd December, 1949, 27th July, 1950 and 26th March and 16th April, 1953, respectively) be amended accordingly.

THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAW, 1950.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Polemi to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Law, 1950, I, the Acting Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Improvement Board of Polemi (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lender") a sum not exceeding two thousand

pounds (£2,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lender in fifteen equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
- (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the erection of a public market, office, public latrines and a slaughter-house and for the asphaltting of the principal streets within the village.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lender all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT REGULATIONS, 1953.

DIRECTIONS UNDER REGULATION 14 (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 14 (b) of the Agricultural Produce Export Regulations, 1953, I, the Director of Agriculture, do hereby direct as follows:—

1.—(1) Potatoes graded as “New Potatoes” (known as scrapers) which are intended for export to any destination must be packed in the following manner:—

(a) In cases with moist peat moss, or

(b) In paper-lined new baskets, the contents of which must not exceed 20 okes (56 lb.) net.

(2) The baskets must be of a standard shape and size and constructed in such a way so that four strengthening wires projecting at the top are incorporated. The baskets should have the following dimensions:—

Internal height 16 inches.

Internal diameter at top 15 inches.

Internal diameter at bottom 10 inches.
