## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2643 MADE UNDER SECTION 52 (a).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 52 (a) of the Customs Cap. 292. Law, and of every other power enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

No. 499. THE SECONDARY EDUCATION LAW. CAP. 205 AND LAWS 5 OF 1950 AND 18 OF 1952.

DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 34 (1).

A. B. WRIGHT, Governor.

Whereas the Governing Body of the Turkish Secondary School, Paphos (hereinafter referred to as "the School"), being a secondary school to which section 24 of the Secondary Education Law (hereinafter referred to as "the Law") is applicable, has applied to the Governor for the declaration of the School to be a Public-aided Secondary School:

Cap. 205. 5 of 1950

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 34 (1) of the Law, I, the Governor, hereby declare the School to be a Public-aided Secondary School.

2. This declaration shall be deemed to have been made on the 1st day of September, 1953.
