LAW, 1950.

## BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF BOGHAZ.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Law, 1950, the Improvement Board of Boghaz hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Boghaz) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1952, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Boghaz) Bye-laws, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Boghaz) Bye-laws, 1951 and 1952. *Gazette :

2. The Second Schedule to the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words " 1 para per oke." appearing opposite items Nos. 22 and 23 and the substitution therefor of the words " two piastres per ton."
