CAP. 292 AND LAWS 5 OF 1952, 19 OF 1953 AND 27 OF 1953.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2649
MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Customs Law, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Houses (Days and Hours of Business) Order, 1953.

2. Subject to clause 3 of this Order all Customs Houses shall be open for the transaction of business on every day in the week as follows:—

(a) In the months of November in every year to May of the following year, both months inclusive—

Week days, except Saturdays . . . 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Saturdays 8 a.m. to 12.00 noon.

(b) In the months of June to October, both months inclusive, in every year—

Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and
Fridays 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Wednesdays 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
Saturdays 8 a.m. to 12.00 noon.

3. All Customs Houses shall be closed for business on Sundays, afternoon on Saturdays, New Year's Day, Good Friday (Greek Orthodox), Saturday before Easter (Greek Orthodox), Easter Monday (Greek Orthodox), Empire Day, Her Majesty's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and any other day appointed by the Governor as a day on which Customs Houses shall be closed for business.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained a Collector may give special permission for overtime work to be carried out by Customs Officers in the District in which he is appointed on any day at such rates as may be prescribed from time to time by the Comptroller for the services of such officers.

5. The Customs Houses (Days and Hours of Business) Order, 1948, is hereby revoked.
