THE CUSTOMS LAW.

CAP. 292 AND LAWS 5 OF 1952, 19 OF 1953 AND 27 OF 1953.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2698

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under section 52 of the Customs Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) (Amendment) Order, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) Orders, 1936 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) Orders, 1936 to 1954.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the substitution for item 2 of the First Schedule thereto of the following item:—

"2. Salt, other than table and rock salt, and salt which the importer declares and the Comptroller is satisfied is to be used solely for industrial purposes.";

(b) by the substitution for item 7 of the First Schedule thereto (referring to Imitation or toy pistols or revolvers) of the following item:—

"7. Imitation or toy pistols or revolvers, excluding sports starting pistols imported and kept in the possession of such *bona fide* persons engaged in athletics for purposes in connection therewith as the Commissioner of Police may approve."
