

## No. 444. THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAW, 1954.

## REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 232.

8 of 1954. In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 232 of the Customs Management Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Management (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 and 1955.

2. The Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of that part thereof from the beginning to, and excluding the part thereof under the heading “Conditions and Exemptions” and the substitution thereof of the following :—

## “CLASS I.—IMPORTED GOODS.

*Division (A).*—Deposited in any place other than a Customs Warehouse.

#### CLASS II.—GOODS FOR EXPORTATION.

Fruit and vegetables, whether fresh or dried, which the Comptroller is satisfied are grown in the Colony, subject to the provisions of paragraph (10) of the Conditions and Exemptions of this Schedule, as follows :—

3. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1955.
