**BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF
MORPHOU.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Morphou hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Morphou Municipal (Amendment No. 2) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to (No. 2) 1955.

2. Bye-law 12 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

"12. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the following goods brought into or on sale in the municipal market :—

(a) Goods other than meat or pork and other than goods referred to in paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) hereof :—

	<i>mils.</i>
(i) When the value of such goods does not exceed 75 mils	5
(ii) When the value of such goods exceeds 75 mils but does not exceed two hundred mils	10
(iii) When the value of such goods exceeds two hundred mils but does not exceed five hundred mils	20
(iv) When the value of such goods exceeds five hundred mils but does not exceed one pound	25
(v) When the value of such goods exceeds one pound, a fee of 5 mils for every additional two hundred mils of such value or part thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 25 mils.	

(b) Potatoes :—

For every ten okes or part thereof a fee of 6 mils.

(c) Oil :—

For every oke a fee of 5 mils.

(d) Game :—

(i) For every hare or brace of partridges or of any other game or wild bird of similar size or of every single partridge or other game or wild bird of similar size, a fee of 15 mils ;

(ii) For beccaficoes or other birds of similar size, for every dozen or part thereof a fee of 15 mils."

3. Bye-law 31 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

"31. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by every person bringing or exposing for sale fresh fish in the fish market, that is to say :—

(a) If the selling price of the fish is 200 mils or less per oke, a fee of 10 mils per oke or part thereof ;

(b) If the selling price of the fish exceeds 200 mils per oke, a fee of 20 mils per oke or part thereof."

4. Bye-law 35 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 35. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought into the animal market :—

| (a) For every ass, mule, horse, camel or ox | 100 |
| Provided that no fee shall be paid for the young ones of the above animals not being more than 12 months old, if running loose with their mothers. | |
| (b) For every goat, sheep, kid, lamb or swine | 25” |

5. Bye-laws 40 and 41 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954) are hereby repealed and the following bye-laws substituted therefor :—

“ 40. There shall be paid for the erection or use of any booth in the fair markets, a fee from one hundred to five thousand mils, for the whole period of the said fairs, to be determined in each case by the Mayor, according to the size and position of each booth.

41. The following tolls shall be paid by every person exposing for sale within the municipal limits during the period of any of the said fairs, for the following goods, articles, things or animals, that is to say :—

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| (a) For any goods, articles or things of any kind (including eatables and liquors) for the whole period of any of the said fairs, a toll of 10 mils for every 250 mils of value of such goods, articles or things, or part thereof ; | |
| (b) For animals :— | <i>mils.</i> |
| (i) For every ass, mule, horse, camel or ox | 100 |
| (ii) For every goat, sheep, kid, lamb or swine | 25” |

6. Bye-law 100 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1952) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 100.—(1) The licensee shall pay in respect of articles, goods or things he hawks about for sale or exposes for sale a fee in accordance with the scale set out hereinafter, for every day upon which he hawks, that is to say :—

(b) Fancy bread or sweets of any kind :—

A fee not less than 10 mils and not more than 50 mils according to the value of such fancy bread or sweet to be determined in each case by the inspector.

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| (c) Fowl and chicken :— | <i>mils.</i> |
| (i) For every live chicken or fowl | 5 |
| (ii) For every live turkey | 20 |
| (iii) For every chicken or fowl killed exposed for sale | 10 |
| (iv) For every turkey killed exposed for sale | 25 |

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the inspector.”

7. Bye-law 125 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 125.—(1) The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in the slaughter-house :—

- (a) For every camel, ox, cow, pig or swine of any age . . . 5 mils per oke.
 - (b) For each goat or sheep of any age 100 mils per oke.
- (2) Weight in this bye-law means the weight of the carcass after it is skinned, cleaned and dressed.”

8. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 133 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1952) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures “ £1. 5s. 0p.” and the substitution therefor of the figures “ £1.250 mils.”

9. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 137 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ a fee of eighteen piastres ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ a fee of one hundred mils.”

10. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 138A of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1952) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ a fee of forty-five piastres ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ a fee of two hundred and fifty mils.”

11. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 138B of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ a fee of forty-five piastres ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ a fee of two hundred and fifty mils.”

12. Bye-law 207 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 207. The following fees shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer by every person exhibiting any notice or advertisement on any hoardings :—

13. Bye-law 210 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 210. There shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer in every year by any person keeping any of the following places or buildings the fee determined by the Council within the limits set out against each :—

(c) For any place or building kept for the purpose of drying or storing skins	500-2000
(d) For any farrier's shop	500-2000

(g) For any kiln	250-2000
(h) For every oven in a bakery	250-2000

(i) For any restaurant	250-3000

(l) For any pastry shop	250-2000
(m) For any confectioner's shop	250-2000
(n) For any pharmacy	500-2000

(p) For any printing office	500-3000

The fee shall be in respect of the period ending on the 31st December of each year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable."

14. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 243 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

"(1) Whenever a municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than the goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of 3 mils per ten oles or part thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that—

- (a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and
- (b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be ten mils."

15. The Second Schedule to the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 164, Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of 10th March, 1955) is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor :—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

(a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and

(b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 10 mils."

The above bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
