Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

(a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and

(b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 5 mils ”.

**No. 710. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.**  
CAP. 142.

**RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF MONI IN  
THE LIMASSOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 9.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Moni hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Moni) Rules, 1955, and shall come into operation on their publication in the *Gazette*.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule, the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the “ Model

Rules”), published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th November, 1952, shall—

(a) be deemed to be rules made by the Village Health Commission of Moni and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the village of Moni:

Provided that for the word “Nikos” and for the word “Nicosia” wherever they occur in the Model Rules, the word “Moni” and the word “Limassol” shall be substituted respectively.

(2) The rules set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding rules of the Village (Nikos) Rules, 1952.

(3) Those rules of the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952, mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, shall not apply to the village of Moni.

##### RULES TO BE SUBSTITUTED.

*Rule 19.* The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say:—

(a) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox .. .. .	50
(b) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep .. .. .	20
(c) For every swine .. .. .	100

*Rule 31.* The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say:—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every load of goods of 30 okes or under .. .. .	15
(b) For every load of goods over 30 okes .. .. .	30
(c) For every motor-lorry or cart of goods .. .. .	100

*Rule 45.* The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say:—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof .. .. .	20
(b) For every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof .. .. .	20
(c) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof .. .. .	50

*Rule 56.* The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any foodstuffs in the market of foodstuffs, that is to say:—

(a) Per stall, per day .. .. .	50
(b) Per stand, per day .. .. .	20
(c) Per stall, per month .. .. .	250
