No. 10. THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS)
REGULATIONS, 1943 TO 1954.

OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE NO. 8800.

The Schedule to the above Open General Import Licence is hereby amended to read as follows :—

“ SCHEDULE.

The Divisions, Groups and Items set out in the second column of this Schedule refer to the Divisions, Groups and Items, respectively, which are set out in the Standard International Trade Classification, published in United Nations Statistical Papers Series M. No. 10, Indexed Edition, April, 1953, and these Open General Licences shall not apply to any goods unless such goods are goods to which the corresponding Division, Group or Item of the Standard International Trade Classification applies.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Licence but is intended to explain its general purport).

The above Schedule lists the goods which may **not** be imported from the United Kingdom or any British Colony except under specific import licence. Goods not included in the Schedule may be so imported by a registered importer under the above Open General Licence, but the Licence does not authorise the import of goods the import of which is prohibited under the Customs Management Laws or any other legislation, and nothing in the Licence shall be construed as exempting anyone from complying with any legislation in force for the time being.
