THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAWS, 1954 AND 1955.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 232.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 232 of the Customs Management Laws, 1954 and 1955, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Drawback (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Customs Drawback Regulations, 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by re-numbering it as 4 (1) and the addition thereto of the following paragraph :—

"(2) In the case of olive oil (edible) for which drawback is claimed under item 8 of Part A of the First Schedule hereto the applicant shall at all times keep an up-to-date book in the form set out in the Appendix contained in the Third Schedule hereto giving the particulars therein indicated".

3. Part A of the First Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition thereto in its appropriate columns of the following :—

"8. Olive oil (edible) excluding olive kernel oil .. 85% of import duty paid .. Payable in respect of olive oil (edible) shown to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to have been used in the manufacture of refined blended olive oil".

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of a Third Schedule as follows :—
