THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,  
1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 13) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 12), 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 13) 1956.

Replacement

2. Regulation 18 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following :—

"Power to  
Governor  
to appoint  
Censors.

18. The Governor may by warrant under his hand appoint a Chief Communications Censor, a Chief Press and Radio Censor, and such number of Postal Censors, Assistant Postal Censors, Telegraph Censors, Assistant Telegraph Censors, Press Censors, Assistant Press Censors, Radio Censors and Assistant Radio Censors as may be required for the purpose of controlling and dealing with postal packets, telegrams, newspapers and broadcasting programmes."

Insertion of

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 19, of the following new Regulation :—

"Powers  
of Postal  
Censor and  
Telegraph  
Censor.

19A. Subject to any special directions by the Governor a Postal Censor and a Telegraph Censor shall have the general direction and control of censorship of all postal packets and telegrams respectively and in the exercise of these functions shall be directly responsible to the Chief Communications Censor and they shall respectively have all the powers of an Assistant Postal Censor and an Assistant Telegraph Censor."

Replacement

tion 23  
of the

Regulations.

4. Regulation 23 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following :—

"Powers  
of Press  
Censor  
and Radio  
Censor.

23. Subject to any special directions by the Governor a Press Censor and a Radio Censor shall have the general direction and control of censorship of all newspapers and all broadcasting services in the Colony respectively and in the exercise of these functions shall be directly responsible to the Chief Press and Radio Censor and they shall respectively have all the powers of an Assistant Press Censor and an Assistant Radio Censor."
