OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE No. 16000.

The above Open General Import Licence is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First and Second Schedules thereto and the substitution therefor of the following Schedules :—

FIRST SCHEDULE.—(Clause 1.)

1. Almonds (Kernels) ;
2. Bananas ;
3. Chickpeas (Revithia) ;
4. Cowpeas (Louvia) ;
5. Haricot beans (Phasolia) ;
6. Olives ;
7. Olive oil in barrels or drums ;
8. Walnut (Kernels).

SECOND SCHEDULE.—(Clause 3.)

All goods enumerated in the First Schedule hereto, up to and including the 15th April, 1956:

Provided that no haricot beans (phasolia) shall be cleared through Customs by virtue of this Licence before the 8th March, 1956.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the licence but it intended to explain its general purport.)

By this amendment authority is given to registered importers to import without specific licence, from the countries listed in Clause 1 of Open General Licence No. 16000, the goods enumerated in the First Schedule until the 15th April, 1956. Its effect is to add haricot beans to the list of goods admissible under the Licence and to extend the final closing date of clearance in respect of most of the other goods enumerated.
