

Amendment of Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations.

5. Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the deletion therefrom of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following sub-paragraphs :—

“(b) wear any article of clothing or other article likely to be mistaken for any such uniform as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a), unless he satisfies the Court that he had no intention that it should be so mistaken ; or

(c) have in his possession, or sell or otherwise dispose of, any such uniform as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) to any person who is not authorized to wear such uniform,” ;

(b) by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (1) thereof, of the following paragraph :—

“(1A) No person shall import any such uniform as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) without a written licence so to do from the Commissioner of Police :

Provided that nothing in this paragraph contained shall apply to Her Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces or to the Government.”.

Amendment of Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations.

6. The definition of “illegal strike”, contained in paragraph (3) of Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “, and which is calculated to, or may entail hardship to the community” (lines 2 and 3).

**No. 19. THE WORKMEN’S COMPENSATION LAW.  
CAP. 216 AND LAWS 14 OF 1951, 22 OF 1952, 1 OF 1954 AND 67 OF 1955.**

APPOINTMENT OF PANEL OF MEDICAL REFEREES UNDER SECTION 28B (1) (vi).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 28B (1) (vi) of the Workmen’s Compensation Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint the following qualified medical practitioners to form a panel of medical referees for the purposes of the aforesaid Law, in connection with the cases set out opposite their respective names :—

(a) the person for the time being holding the office of Senior Specialist (Physician), for diseases falling into the medical category ;

(b) the person for the time being holding the office of Senior Specialist (Surgeon), for cases falling under general surgery ; and

(c) the person for the time being holding the office of Senior Specialist (Orthopaedic Surgeon), for cases of an orthopaedic nature.

2. The appointments made under Notification No. 72 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th February, 1954, and under Notification No. 464 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 4th August, 1955, are hereby revoked.

**THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.**

CAP. 233 AND LAW 26 OF 1952.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to acquire certain lands situated at Knodhara in the District of Famagusta for the purpose of erecting thereon a Moslem Secondary School (Orta Okul) :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor hereby declares the acquisition of the said lands for the aforesaid purpose to be an undertaking of public utility and does hereby authorise the carrying out of the said undertaking and hereby entrusts the Governing Body for the Moslem Secondary Schools, Famagusta, with the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking, the cost whereof shall be borne by the Governing Body hereinbefore mentioned.

(The Governing Bodies for the Moslem Secondary Schools have been recognized as public bodies for the purposes of the Land Acquisition Law, under Notification No. 23 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 21st January, 1953).

**THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.**

CAP. 233 AND LAW 26 OF 1952.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to establish, within the limits of Strovolos village, a scheme to supply water to the Government quarters in the surrounding areas, in the District of Nicosia :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare the establishment, within the limits of Strovolos village, of the aforesaid scheme to be an undertaking of public utility and hereby authorises the carrying out of the said undertaking and does hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Water Development.
