**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)  
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 6) 1956.**

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 34 (1). *Reg. 34 (1)*

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 34 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 6) 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Control of Motor Transport) Order, 1956.
2. Notwithstanding anything in any Law or public instrument contained, from and after the 9th May, 1956, the vehicles specified in the Schedule hereto shall not be used on any road within the Colony unless the person driving such vehicle is in possession of a permit granted to him under the hand of the Commissioner of Police, or under the hand of any person authorised by him in that behalf, and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such permit.
3. Every person in charge of a motor vehicle shall render such motor vehicle, when not being driven, incapable of use either by securely locking the vehicle or by removing therefrom a part of the mechanism.
4. Nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any person acting in the course of his duty as—
  - (a) a member of Her Majesty's Forces ; or
  - (b) a member of the Cyprus Police Force ; or
  - (c) a member of the Special Constabulary.

**SCHEDULE.**

1. Public Service motor vehicle of seven seats or less.
2. Self-drive motor vehicle.
