EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Licence but is intended to explain its general purport).

This Open General Licence replaces Licence No. 20000, incorporating the amendments made thereto in October, 1956, and including a few new items. Rice, sugar, coffee and edible vegetable oils have been excluded. Spain and Iceland are added to the countries to which the Licence applies.

The amendments to the Second Schedule mean that specific licences will in future be required for certain classes of goods hitherto on Open General Licence, when imported from the Middle Eastern countries listed in that Schedule.

The import of many goods included in the Open General Licence is subject to a licence under the hand of the Director of Agriculture or other appropriate Authority, as the case may be. The fact that any such goods are included in this Open General Licence does **not** mean that import will be permitted unless the importer holds the necessary licence from the appropriate Authority.

THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS) REGULATIONS, 1956.

AMENDMENT TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE No. 8800.

The Schedule to the above Open General Import Licence which was published under Notification No. 365 in *Gazette Supplement* No. 3 of the 16th June, 1955, as

amended by Notification No. 10, published in *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of the 5th January, 1956, is cancelled and the following is substituted therefor :—

The Divisions, Groups and Items set out in the second column of this Schedule refer to the Divisions, Groups and Items, respectively, which are set out in the Standard International Trade Classification, published in United Nations Statistical Papers Series M. No. 10, Indexed Edition, April, 1953, and this Open General Licence shall not apply to any goods unless such goods are goods to which the corresponding Division, Group or Item of the Standard International Trade Classification applies.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(*This note is not part of the Licence but is intended to explain its general purport.*)

The above Schedule lists the goods which may not be imported from the United Kingdom or any British Colony except under specific import licence. Items 3, 7, 8 and 9 (Rice, Sugar, Coffee and edible oils) are added to the list of such goods. Goods not included in the Schedule may be so imported by a registered importer under the above Open General Licence, but the Licence does not authorise the import of goods the import of which is prohibited under the Customs Management Laws or any other legislation, and nothing in the Licence shall be construed as exempting anyone from complying with any legislation in force for the time being.
