THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 2nd November, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 24th January, 1957, under Notification No. 66 (as amended by Notification No. 401 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 11th April, 1957) (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Paleometokho village, Nicosia District (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisation for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 2nd May, 1957, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by virtue of the Orders, a list of which appears in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the lands and properties set out in the Second Schedule to the Orders (hereinafter referred to as "the lands"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas the Orders were subsequently extended, on the dates appearing in the Third Column of the Schedule hereto, for a period of six months from the expiration thereof;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the lands should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisations for using the lands for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Orders be continued for a further period of six months as from the date of the expiration of the extending orders and the Orders are hereby extended accordingly.
