THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.

CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952, 43 OF 1955 AND 22 OF 1956.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to acquire certain lands situated at Lefka, in the District of Nicosia, for the purpose of erecting thereon a Moslem Secondary School (Orta Okul):

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor does hereby declare the acquisition of the said lands for the aforesaid purpose to be an undertaking of public utility and does hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and does hereby entrust the Governing Body for the Moslem Secondary School, Lefka, with the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking, the cost whereof shall be borne by the Governing Body hereinbefore mentioned.

THE EXCHANGE CONTROL LAWS, 1952 AND 1954.

ORDER MADE BY THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY UNDER SECTION 23 (1) (b).

3 of 1952
51 of 1954.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 23 of the Exchange Control Laws, 1952 and 1954, I, the Financial Secretary, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Exchange Control (Importation of Turkish Currency Notes) Order, 1957.
2. Notes of a class which are, or have at any time been, legal tender in Turkey are hereby specified as notes the importation into the Colony of which is prohibited under section 23 of the Exchange Control Laws, 1952 and 1953, except with the permission of the Financial Secretary.
3. There shall be exempted from the provisions of section 2 of this Order the importation into the Colony on the person of or in the baggage of a traveller to the Colony in any ship or aircraft from some place outside the Colony of notes of the class specified in the aforesaid section not exceeding one hundred and fifty Turkish pounds.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

This Order restricts the quantity of Turkish Currency which may be imported into Cyprus except with the express permission of the Financial Secretary.
