ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2969

1. This Order may be cited as Vicos Grain (Control) (Cancellation) Order, 1957.

2. The Vicos Grain (Control) Order, 1957, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* No. 4054 of the 1st June, 1957, is hereby cancelled with effect from 1st October, 1957, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

No. 950. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAW.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2970

MADE UNDER SECTION 124 (1).

Authority to the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Larnaca to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 124 (1) of the Municipal Corporations Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. The Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Councillors and Townsmen of the Municipal Corporation of Larnaca (hereinafter referred to as "the Municipal Corporation") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lender") the sum of thirty-one thousand pounds (£31,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four and a half per centum ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Municipal Corporation to the Lender in twenty equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest), the first instalment being payable one year after the date of borrowing and all subsequent instalments being payable on the corresponding date of each year following until final repayment;
- (b) the Municipal Corporation shall, in each year and until final repayment of the sum borrowed, insert in the annual estimates as a charge on its revenues the annual sum payable as aforesaid in the year to which such estimates relate;
- (c) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Municipal Corporation for—
 - (i) the completion of the works in progress at the wholesale municipal market;
 - (ii) the erection of public latrines and cold stores;
 - (iii) the purchase of a road vehicle weighbridge;
 - (iv) the acquisition of property for the improvement of the municipal poor house

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Municipal Corporation is hereby authorized, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, to mortgage to the Lender all the rates, fees and duties now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Municipal Corporation.

No. 951. THE RURAL CONSTABLES LAW.

CAP. 267 AND LAWS 46 OF 1954 AND 59 OF 1955.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 5 (3).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 5 (3) of the Rural Constables Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Rural Constables (Minimum Salary) Order, 1957.

2. From and after the 1st day of January, 1958, the monthly salary to be paid to every rural constable or temporary rural constable shall not be less than £18 :

Provided that if a rural constable or temporary rural constable is required to keep a horse his monthly salary shall not be less than £19.

3. The Rural Constables (Minimum Salary) Order, 1955, is hereby revoked.
