ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 24th April, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 26th April, 1956, under Notification No. 331 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Pomos (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications No. 1165, 400 and 900 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 29th November, 1956, 11th April, 1957 and 3rd October, 1957, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 23rd April, 1958;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisation for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 24th April, 1958, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

Whereas by Order dated the 3rd October, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 11th October, 1956, under Notification No. 964 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Arab Ahmed Quarter, Nicosia (hereinafter referred to as "the land") subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;
