 - 2. Order 8 Rule 1 of the principal Rules is hereby amended as follows:—
 (a) by the substitution of "£50" for "£10" in the first line of paragraph (i) thereof; and

(b) by the substitution of "£2" for "10s." in the second line of paragraph (ii) thereof.

3. Order 8 Rule 2 is amended by the addition thereto of the following as sub-rule (3):—

"(3) No Court fees shall be payable on filing any such application or in respect of the affidavit accompanying it."
