**No. 664. THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1956.**

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Secondary Schools) Regulations, 1958. Short title.
  - 2.—(1) In these Regulations unless a contrary intention appears :— Interpre-  
    - “ child ” means a person under the age of 21 years ;
    - “ headmaster ” includes any person performing the duties of headmaster during the absence of the headmaster from a school ;
    - “ secondary school ” means any school or other educational establishment, wherein pupils over the age of twelve years are taught, and includes the English School established under the English School (Management and Control) Law : tation.

- (2) The Interpretation Law shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations, and of any direction given thereunder, as it applies to the interpretation of a Law and, for the purposes of the said Law, these Regulations shall be deemed to be Laws. Cap. 1

Enrolment  
and attend-

3.—(1) Where the parent or guardian of any child seeks to enrol such child as a pupil at a secondary school, the headmaster of such secondary school shall, before such child is enrolled, enquire from such parent or guardian where such child has previously attended school, and such headmaster shall not enrol or permit such child to be enrolled as a pupil or permit such child to attend such secondary school, if such child has, during any part of the period of one year immediately preceding, been a pupil at another secondary school unless the consent of the Director of Education to the enrolment of such child has first been obtained.

(2) Where any child has been enrolled as a pupil at a secondary school but has not, on the date of the coming into force of these Regulations, commenced attending such secondary school for tuition the headmaster of such secondary school shall enquire from the parent or guardian of such child where such child has previously attended school and such headmaster shall not permit such child to attend such secondary school if such child has, during any part of the period of one year immediately preceding, been a pupil at another secondary school unless the consent of the Director of Education to the attendance of such child has first been obtained.

(3) If the Director of Education is satisfied that any child attending a secondary school in respect of whom no consent has been given under paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Regulation, has, during any part of the period of one year immediately preceding the date of his commencing attendance for tuition at such secondary school, been a pupil at another secondary school, he may serve a notice in writing upon the headmaster of such first mentioned secondary school directing such headmaster to expel such child from such secondary school.

Appoint-

4.—(1) Where any person seeks appointment at a secondary school as a teacher the headmaster of such secondary school shall, before such person is appointed, enquire from such person where he has been teaching during the period of one year immediately preceding and such headmaster shall not appoint such person or permit such person to be appointed a teacher at such secondary school or permit such person to teach in such secondary school in any capacity if such person has, during any part of the period of one year immediately preceding, been a teacher at another secondary school unless the consent of the Director of Education to the appointment of such teacher has first been obtained.

(2) If the Director of Education is satisfied that any person teaching at a secondary school, in respect of whom no consent has been given under paragraph (1) of this Regulation, has, during any part of the period of one year immediately preceding the date of his commencing teaching at such secondary school, been a teacher at another secondary school, he may serve a notice in writing upon the headmaster of such first mentioned secondary school directing such headmaster to dismiss such teacher from such secondary school.

5.—(1) Any headmaster who—

(a) contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of regulation 3 ; or

(b) contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) of regulation (4), shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

(2) Any headmaster who fails to comply with or disobeys any direction in writing given under paragraph (3) of regulation 3 or under paragraph (2) of regulation 4 shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds and to a further fine of fifty pounds in respect of each day during which the offence is proved to have been continued after the service upon such headmaster of such direction.

6.—(1) It shall not be lawful for a secondary school to have attending as pupils in the first year a greater number of such pupils than was attending the first year of such secondary school in the month of September, 1956, unless the permission of the Director of Education to any excess in such numbers has first been obtained, or, if such permission has been obtained, it shall not be lawful for such secondary school to have attending as pupils in the first year a greater number of pupils in excess of those attending the first year of such secondary school in the month of September, 1956, than that specified in such permission.

(2) Any headmaster of a secondary school at which pupils are attending in contravention of paragraph (1) of this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds or to imprisonment for six months, or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Arrest and Detention) (Temporary Provisions) (Amendment) Regulations, 1958, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Arrest and Detention) (Temporary Provisions) Regulations, 1958 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").
2. Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the word "two" which occurs in the first line thereof and substituting therefor the word "four".
